NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

MEDIA BULLETIN

DATED: 08/04/2020 Evening Report

World Health Organization has declared the recent Novel Corona virus, COVID-19 as **Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC)** which has affected **209 countries** / **territories** including India till date. WHO has characterized COVID-19 as a **Pandemic** on 11th March 2020.

In this context, Karnataka state has strengthened all surveillance and containment measures against the possible spread of disease.

On 07.04.2020, 20 individuals have been screened at Mangaluru port.

"As of 5:00 PM of 8th April 2020, cumulatively 181 COVID-19 positive cases have been confirmed in the state, it includes 5 deaths & 28 discharges"

Out of remaining cases 148, 146 COVID-19 positive patients (including 1 pregnant woman) are in isolation at designated hospitals are stable and 2 *in ICU* (P43 on oxygen and P101 on Ventilators).

6 new cases have been confirmed for COVID-19 in the state from 07.04.2020, 5:00 PM to 08.04.2020 5:00 PM.

Programmatic Updates

- Department of Health & Family Welfare have issued circular regarding clarifications for Quarantine in case COVID-19 test comes out positive for primary contacts.
 - Given advisory for home & institutional quarantine and negative cases to be discharged from quarantine period including medical follow up such cases in the community (home quarantine).
- In continuation to the letter by Secretary, MoHFW, GoI (D.O. No.Z.21020/16/2020-PH, dated 30.03.2020) addressed to all the Chief Secretaries / Administrators of the State / UTs and the Heads of all the Associations of Doctors / Healthcare providers regarding "Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Package: Insurance Scheme for Health Workers Fighting COVID-19". It is directed to communicate all such workers health care providers through various mediums like SMS, whatsapp, e-mail etc. in local language about their inclusion under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Package.
 - Claim Form-I (Personal Accident Insurance Claim Form for loss of life due to COVID-19) and
 - Form-II (Personal Accident Insurance Claim Form for accidental loss of life on account of COVID-19 related duty).
- In view of recent revision of protocol by ICMR-GoI and superseding all the previous circulars, Department of Health & Family Welfare has issued *revised lab testing protocols for COVID-19* on 07.04.2020.

In view to provide the transportation facilities for the Non-COVID-19 medical services i.e. who require medical emergency during this COVID-19 lockdown period, Department of Health & Family Welfare Services has permitted to the Private Cab Operators (Uber & Ola) to provide 100 vehicles each by issuing a circular on 07.04.2020. In view of breaking the chain and containment of COVID-19, Karnataka State Board of Augaf, 5 Bengaluru has directed to all the managements not to allow any congregational prayers in the Masajid and the managements of the Qabrasthans (Muslim graveyards) / Darghas throughout the state and to suspend the visit of public on the occasion of SHAB-E-BARAT on thursday, 9th April 2020. No public shall be allowed to perform religious rituals in the Qabrasthans / Darghas and all the gates of Qabrasthans / Darghas shall be kept closed. All managements of Qabrasthans / Darghas shall take necessary action on the above directions and all Wagf officers, District Wagf Advisory Committee in state shall adhere to the orders and directed to circulate the same and to ensure the order is followed scrupulously. In 31 Fever Clinics of BBMP, in total 168 people have been screened on 07.04.2020 and till on date 2342 people have been screened. Home Quarantine Enforcement squad have quarantined 16 persons in institutions on 07.04.2020 7 based on the complaints received from public & totally till date 402 have been shifted from home Quarantine to institutional quarantine. 8 The positive cases and suspects hospitalized in the designated hospitals and quarantined persons will be staying there for a minimum period of 14 days or till the successive samples of the positive case are proved negative or as per the treating physicians advice. This long duration of stay in isolation requires a mental booster for keeping oneself calm & quite. Foreseeing this department has arranged for mental health counseling of such patients and contacts 1,105 sessions were held on 07.04.2020 and so far 27,183 number of counseling sessions have been held counseling sessions for migrants. 9 Any person who has attended Tablighi Jamaat Congregation at Nizamuddin Markaz Masjid in New Delhi, kindly contact **080-29711171** Arogya Sayavaani. 10 Appeal to Doctors has been issued by Hon'ble Chief Minister to give missed call to **08047192219** or signup at https://forms.gle/TPbU7eZgazdxG9gS9 to volunteer for COVID-19 telemedicine facility and to help the Government. 11 Corona Watch mobile application can be downloaded from www.karnataka.gov.in In the application you can see the spots visited by positive patients upto 14 days prior to testing positive. 210 lines have been reserved for receiving calls of COVID-19 on 07.04.2020 calls 9,937 have been received and around 24,382 calls have outgone along with 24 manual calls has been done, for whom necessary guidance has been provided.

Appeal to Public: Any person who has returned from COVID-19 affected countries or has been in personal contact with such person must remain in home isolation for 14 days from arrival in India irrespective of having any symptoms or not. Also, should self-notify to nearest government hospital or call 104 health

helpline. Maintain personal hygiene, use tissue paper/handkerchief while coughing or sneezing, frequently wash hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer and avoid attending mass social gatherings.
